## II. RESULTS OF THE IPARD II MONITORING COMMITTEE MEETING

### Opening of the meeting

Mr. Frank Bollen, Head of Unit G4 at DG AGRI, welcomed the members of the IPARD Monitoring Committee. He expressed his satisfaction with the implementation of the IPARD Programme 2014-2020. Although, new IPARD III Programme was approved by EC in March 2022, other agreements remain to be finalized, all in order to start the implementation of the new IPARD III Programme as soon as possible.

### **With reference to item 1 of the agenda: "Adoption of the draft agenda for the tenth meeting of the IPARD II Monitoring Committee"**

The Chairperson of the IPARD II Monitoring Committee (IPARD II MC), Mr. Rexhail Ismaili opened the tenth meeting of the Committee by welcoming all attendees. He informed the members on the proposed agenda for the tenth meeting of the IPARD II MC.

None of the members of the Committee had any remarks regarding the agenda, and the following decision was adopted:

**Decision No. 1: IPARD II Monitoring Committee adopted the agenda for the tenth meeting of the Monitoring Committee.**

### **With reference to item 2 of the agenda: "Adoption of the Minutes of the previous ninth IPARD II MC meeting held on 15<sup>th</sup> of December 2021"**

The Chairperson of the IPARD II MC informed that the minutes from the previous meeting of the Monitoring Committee held on 15<sup>th</sup> of December 2021, were sent to the members of the Committee on 20<sup>th</sup> of January 2022, and no comments were submitted from the members to the Secretariat till 03<sup>rd</sup> of February 2022.

The members of the IPARD II MC did not have any remarks on the minutes and the following decision was adopted:

**Decision No. 2: The IPARD II Monitoring Committee adopted the minutes of the ninth meeting of the IPARD II Monitoring Committee, held on 15<sup>th</sup> December 2021, as final.**

### **With reference to item 3 of the agenda: "Information on the implementation of the decisions /conclusions adopted at the previous ninth meeting of the IPARD II MC".**

The Head of the Managing Authority, Mr. Zhivko Brajkovski, informed on the progress made in the implementation of the decisions/conclusions adopted at the previous meeting of the IPARD II MC.

Regarding this item, the members of the Committee adopted the following conclusion:

**Conclusion No. 1: The IPARD II Monitoring Committee was informed on the progress made in implementing the decisions/conclusions of the eighth meeting of the IPARD II Monitoring Committee.**

**With reference to item 4 of the agenda: "Information regarding the IPA Monitoring Committee".**

The representative of the National IPA Coordinator, Ms. Dana Petreska informed about the meeting of the IPA Monitoring Committee, which was held on 22.03.2022. Regarding IPARD Agency, a conclusion that refers to the need of providing new premises was reached, as well as conclusion for fulfilling the human capacities in the Agency. EC representative, Mr. Zigo Rutkovskis added that these are top priorities not only for the finalization of IPARD II Programme but also for the implementation of IPARD III. The Director of the Agency, Mr. Nikica Bachovski informed that they are still facing an outflow of staff. For that purpose, hiring of new staff as well as internal reorganization in the Agency will be discussed on Governmental sessions. He added that a conclusion was reached on Governmental session regarding the new premises which have to be ceded to IPARD Agency. Funds have been provided for their renovation and adaptation through the World Bank project.

Regarding this item, the members of the Committee adopted the following conclusion:

**Conclusion No. 2: The IPARD II Monitoring Committee was informed regarding IPA Monitoring Committee.**

**In relation to item 5 of the Agenda: "Status with the implementation of the IPARD Programme 2014-2020".**

**In relation to sub-item 5.1 of the agenda: "Information on the progress of activities of IPARD Agency regarding the implementation of the Programme".**

Regarding approval and payment of the applications, representatives of the IPARD Agency, Nanevski and Hristov presented the results of the implementation of the Public Call Program (Annex 3 of the minutes).

Mr. Vangel Nanevski pointed out that modification of the ranking procedure has greatly accelerated the process of processing requests from Public Call 01/2020 for Measure 1 and Public Call 01/2021 for Measure 7. In order to shorten the time required for processing the requests, evaluation committee, i.e. external experts has been introduced. They give their opinion regarding market prices separately for each item of the offer. This facilitated the determination of prices for specific (custom made) types of equipment.

Main reason for rejection of applications in all three measures are incomplete applications. Huge delay in the process of contracting the applications presents the slow respond of the Bureau for Court Expertise in the process of determining the reasonableness of the costs. Also, due to the Covid-19 virus pandemic, the response of companies that were contacted in the market price research process was very low. The large number of applications received and the insufficient number of employees is still a problem in the applications processing process.

Representatives of IPARD Agency reported that several applicants due to price increases and high difference between the approved price and real market price cancel the realization of concluded

agreements. With these cancellations, allocated funds were released, which opens an opportunity to announce another public call from IPARD 2014-2020 for Measure 3 in July 2022.

In order to avoid de-commitment in 2022, 8,6 million euros have to be paid until 31.12.2022.

Introduction of advance payment is a novelty that has great significance and IPARD Agency will implement it in future. This means that Agency would allow the payment of advance funds in relation to the concluded contract up to 50% of the value of the support. The IPARD structure is actively working on the approval of this procedure, which means that every final beneficiary that concludes a contract or has concluded a contract, in a certain period will have the right for an advance payment up to 50% of the value of the support, but with provision of a bank guarantee in the amount of 110% of the requested support.

Regarding human resources, representative of the IPARD Agency, Mr. Vangel Nanevski informed that the implementation of new measures in IPARD III Programme requires additional human resources. The Agency continues to face an outflow of experienced staff. It is necessary to strengthen the policy of retaining and motivating employees.

Regarding the question of the representative of Chamber of Crafts of RNM, Mr. Agron Fazliji, is there an equal approval of projects by planning regions, the director of the IPARD Agency, Mr. Nikica Bachovski answered that for that purpose workshops were organized, i.e. info days, in order for potential users from all over the country to get informed with the opportunities offered by the IPARD Programme. Head of MA, Mr. Zhivko Brajkovski, added that the regional development strategy is a policy of the state, i.e. a governmental strategy, and that that is reflected in IPARD III Programme.

Regarding the question of representative of MAFWE, Mr. Sasho Kutleshovski, whether the advance payment would be a risk for the IPARD Agency, Mr. Vangel Nanevski answered that the lack of funds needed for investment is one of the reasons for cancelling projects. The Director of the IPARD Agency, Mr. Nikica Bachovski explained that it will attract larger investments, greenfield investments, investments in processing, investments that will generate new jobs and greater absorption of funds.

Regarding this sub-item, the following conclusion was adopted:

**Conclusion No. 3: The IPARD II Monitoring Committee was informed on the progress of activities of IPARD Agency.**

**In relation to sub item 5.2 of the Agenda: "Information on the results from the implementation of the IPARD Programme through data/indicators for monitoring."**

Regarding this sub-item, the MA representative, presented in details the results of the implementation of the Programme by public calls, measures, types of sectors in the measures and types of investments. He also referred to the geographical aspect of the implementation of the Programme

Regarding this sub-item, the following conclusion was adopted:



**Conclusion No. 4: The IPARD II Monitoring Committee was informed on the results from the implementation of the IPARD Programme through data/indicators for monitoring.**

In relation to item 6 of the Agenda: "Discussion /approval of the annual implementation report"

The representative of MA, Mr. Viktor Mladenovski, informed about the Annual Report for implementation of IPARD 2014-2020. Taking into account that the report was submitted late to the members of the Committee, it will be adopted by written procedure in order for the members to have additional time to review it.

Regarding this sub-item, members of the MC adopted the following conclusion:

**Conclusion No. 5: The IPARD II Monitoring Committee was informed on the annual implementation report.**

With reference to item 7 of the agenda: "Technical Assistance activities"

Sub-item 7.1 of the agenda: "Information on the progress of APTA 2022 implementation"

Realization of the procurement for publicity campaign of the IPARD Programme is still in progress. It is in phase of reviewing the tender dossier by IPARD Agency. Tender for the specific procurement will be announced soon. Regarding APTA for 2022, the following procurement has been realized: "Synchronization of procedures of the IPARD Agency with the criteria of the new programme for existing measures - measures 1, 3, 6 and 7". During 2022, APTA may undergo some changes.

Regarding this item, the following conclusion was adopted:

**Conclusion No. 6: IPARD II Monitoring Committee was informed on the progress of APTA 2021 implementation.**

Sub-item 7.2 of the agenda: "Information on the progress of activities related to the Communication and Publicity of the IPARD Programme 2014-2020"

The MA representative, Mr. Kiril Ristoski, informed about the activities within the publicity campaign for the IPARD Programme 2014-2020, foreseen in the Annual action plan for communication and publicity of the IPARD Programme 2014-2020 for 2022. He presented the realized activities as well as the future planned activities regarding communication and publicity for 2022.

Regarding this sub-item, the following conclusion was adopted:

**Conclusion No. 7: The IPARD II Monitoring Committee was informed on the progress of activities related to the communication and publicity of the IPARD Programme 2014-2020**

In relation to item 8 of the Agenda: "Information on the functioning of the IPARD Programme 2014-2020 monitoring and control system".

The NAO representative, Mr. Vlado Karamanolevski, informed the Committee regarding the management and control system of IPARD. Two changes have been made in the system: changes in the internal working procedures of the IPARD Agency and minor changes in the Internal Manuals of the Management Structure. IPARD Operating structure is preparing modification of the IPARD Agency's Manual of Procedures regarding the introduction of an advance payment.

The IPARD II Monitoring Committee was also informed about the internal audits carried out during 2021 by the Internal Audit Department within each institution. 3 verification visits have been planned for 2022 by NAO.

Regarding human capacities, i.e. retention of already existing experienced staff, NAO has initiated a procedure where EC is required to consider the possibility of providing additional financial resources. National Coordinators of the countries in the region were also informed about this procedure.

Regarding the risk of losing funds in 2022, he informed that there is no potential risk of de-commitment of funds.

Regarding this sub-item, the following conclusion was adopted:

**Conclusion No. 8: The IPARD II Monitoring Committee was informed on functioning of the monitoring and control system.**

With reference to item 9 of the agenda: „Information/discussion on results of the on-going evaluation of IPARD Programme".

Sub-item 9.1 of the agenda: "Progress of activities related to evaluation of the IPARD Programme 2014- 2020".

The MA representative, Mr. Aleksandar Anteski presented the details regarding the evaluation of the IPARD Programme 2014-2020, i.e. planned activities. The following were identified as obstacles to the implementation of the evaluation activities

- The lack of human capacity related to evaluation activities;
- The delay of information and data transfer from the Agency;
- Inconsistent data regarding the implementation of IPARD II Programme.

Regarding this sub-item, the following conclusion was adopted:

**Conclusion No. 9: IPARD II Monitoring Committee was informed about the ongoing evaluation of IPARD Programme 2014-2020.**

With reference to item 10 of the agenda: "Status of IPARD III Programme 2021- 2027"

Sub-item 10.1 of the agenda: "Information on status of the IPARD Programme 2021-2027"

Mr. Aleksandar Anteski informed about the status of the IPARD Programme 2021-2027.

The Financing and Partnership Framework Agreement (FFPA) is expected to be signed and ratified in June 2022, as well as the Sectoral Agreement which is also expected to be ratified in June 2022. It is planned to prepare a list of eligible costs that will be common to all countries beneficiaries of IPARD. This is necessary in order to prepare the materials for publicity and to announce a public call. The first public call for IPARD III is expected to be in the last quarter of 2022.

Regarding the question of the representative of AGRO-LEADER, Marina Tosheska, when accreditation of Measure 5 can be expected, Mr. Nikica Bachovski answered that additional human resources are needed, i.e. people with vocational education, which is a challenge to find in terms of administrative salaries. MAFWE and IPARD Agency already have experience in managing LAG with support from the National Rural Development Programme. Regarding human resources, there is a possibility at some stage of the accreditation of that measure, to include some existing facilities that operate outside the IPARD structure, and are currently working on national programs and already have some initial experience with LAGs and the LEADER measure. Head of MA, Mr. Zhivko Brajkovski added that the first priority is the accreditation of already accredited measures. Regarding the new measures, if all the conditions are fulfilled, they will go in an accreditation package.

Considering that ratification of FFPA and the ratification of the Sectoral Agreement can take a long time, EC representative, Mr. Zigo Rutkovskis pointed out that this will affect the announcement of the first call for IPARD III, and also the accreditation of existing measures. The procedure for transfer of management powers (roll over) of Measures 1, 3, 7 and 9, will be communicated to national authorities and it is expected to be simplified, i.e. complete package would not be required but only a letter with description of the measures (in case there are no major changes in the procedures). In terms of human resources, there is a difference between the necessary and the actual number of employees at the moment. Regarding the accreditation of the new measures, including the measure of investments in rural public infrastructure and LEADER, the staff capacities should be further increased. Regarding the system for electronic processing of applications within IPARD 3, which is still under development, he added that it is necessary for the stakeholders to be prepared for that innovation, i.e. to be informed in a timely manner.

Regarding this sub-item, the following conclusion was adopted:

**Conclusion No. 10: IPARD II Monitoring Committee was informed about status of the IPARD Programme 2021-2027**

**With reference to item 11 of the Agenda: "AOB"**

Regarding this item, no discussion was raised.

**With reference to item 11 of the Agenda: "Proposal for the Agenda of the next tenth IPARD II MC meeting/agreement on indicative new date "**

Regarding item 12 of the Agenda, the Chairperson informed on the draft agenda for the 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the IPARD II Monitoring Committee. He proposed the date for the next 11<sup>th</sup> meeting to be agreed in accordance with the availability of the representatives of the European Commission.

The Chairperson of the Monitoring Committee closed the meeting and declared it as successful.
